

Graduate Students Study Abroad Program

National Science Council, Republic of China (Taiwan)

Introduction

The Graduate Students Study Abroad Program, sponsored by the National Science Council, is intended to subsidize Taiwanese Ph.D. students to conduct research at an accredited educational institute abroad. The goal of this program is to encourage participants to gain international experience, to expand their research training and pave a way for future international collaborations for a maximum of twelve months.

Eligibility

- The applicant must be a citizen of the Republic of China (Taiwan).
- The applicant must be a Ph.D. student currently enrolled in an accredited educational institute in Taiwan and must have completed at least one year study in the Ph.D. program.
- The applicant must file the grant application through his/her enrolled school.

Award

- The grant period can range from seven to twelve months.
- The amount of grant is based on the grant period, ranging up to a maximum of 18,000 US dollars (600,000 NT dollars) for a twelve-month study.
- The grant period starts on the following date which comes the later: 1. the date for the grant recipient to arrive at the host institute, or 2. the date to complete signing of the binding contract.
- Due to fund limitation, only the grant recipients themselves rather than the institutes or advisors will be subsidized by the National Science Council.
- During the recipient's stay, all office space and related equipment for research shall be provided by the host institutes or advisors.
